Be an upstander not a bystander

As part of the Big Ask, students told us they would like additional systems for reporting concerns in school. They would also like to be able to make anonymous reports.

There is now a dropbox in the Library where students can post notes in order to report concerns. This is emptied daily.

There is also a button on the school website where reports can be made (with an anonymous option). This mailbox is monitored Monday to Friday during term time.
