GCSE/BTEC RESULTS DAY AND POST-RESULTS SERVICES

I would like to ensure that you are all aware of the arrangements for collecting GCSE/BTEC results as well as understand the services that are available to support you after you have received your examination results.

GCSE/BTEC Results Day - Thursday 21 August 2025

Students are invited to collect their examination results from school on **Thursday 21 August between 8.30am and 11am**. Students will need to enter the site via the Derby Road entrance and collect results from the **Dining Hall** and are required to sign for your results and confirm Post-16 destinations before your results are issued. Members of the senior leadership team will be available should students need to discuss Post-16 pathway or have any queries or concerns regarding examination results.

Post-results services

There are a wide range of services available for students to make use of in the event of a query or concern regarding their examination results. Students may request access to examination scripts, clerical re-checks and reviews of marking. Further details of how to request any of these services are available on our website however all requests must be made through the centre and not directly to the awarding examination body.

There will be further information regarding post-results services on the examination section of the website prior to results day.

Please note that there may be a cost attached to a request for a review of marking. GCSE/BTEC certificates will be available for collection from school from mid-November onwards.
